Director's Note

Welcome to You, Our Theater Loving Audience! We are thrilled to share with you the second iteration of our latest work, *The She-Wolves* (*Salvaging Shakespeare's Women.*)

A generous award from The National Endowment for the Arts and Arts Midwest through their Shakespeare in American Communities grant set this devising work in motion last winter. Utilizing Shakespeare's stories for a new work that engages with the mission of our company was a most delicious challenge.

The question we faced was how to create a devised work with the chosen characters in a way that rings fresh, applies possibly new considerations to their narratives, and allows us a way in to investigate 400 year old themesand do these reflect our modern existence?

So we begin this play with a mode of storytelling that contains threads which run throughout all of time - a fairy tale. Fairy tales are just the very best way to share a story, I feel. They're an imaginative landscape where anything can happen, they are infused with magic, and terror runs rampant in them. Many times, this terror becomes the event that builds the strength and courage upon which a character stands, turning their sorry state around, the blood to informative symbolism, or exposes one's true nature.

In our case here, we have a character of Shakespeare's whom we never see or hear in his final play, *The Tempest*, but we certainly hear *about* her. As is a common practice for our company, we gave her, Sycorax, the imaginative pen to hold for kicking off our story, to set a landscape of evocative strangeness, spells, and unpredictable power shifts.

The threads we are pulling from in our work here and with which we still have further to go, involve the following questions and considerations:

- *How do we listen to and make room for other's stories?
- *How much or how little has changed for women and others who have been silenced through political and bigoted maneuverings in what they are faced with, forced to suffer and endure?
- *Observing the brutally harmful "Winner takes all" approach to politics, governance, and cultural perspectives.
- *Understanding better the many masks we wear, why we wear them, and identifying which ones are driven by the basic need to stay alive, ie: rendering some masks fundamental due to the culture we've created.
- *Observing the important nature of the pack, led by an intelligent, compassionate, loyal leader. How might we empower this in our day-to-day?

*If any of these characters were to rewrite the ending to their story, what would they imagine? What words would they use? Would we listen to them?

*What does it mean to have a sovereign voice and how can we, as a culture, amplify through written and spoken words historically silenced voices?

*Identifying the effects of Fascism on a woman's body and voice.

These are considerations that we feel are responsibilities we hold as we make the story and share the art. Out of these we wonder how we progress to our next iteration to deepen our staging, choreography, and text to explore these threads more fully.

The work lies ahead. We are honored to be in the world as theater makers trusted with this task of pulling classical text and stories in to play in the pool of our present day to feel and express the human resonance throughout time. As our society continues to move, evolve, degrade, dance the horrible and also wondrous dance of humanity, we are grateful to all the writers - all of them - and all the theater practitioners who help us create, explore, and bring to life this beautiful feat called LIVING in this remarkable world. I am deeply grateful to this formidable, talented, hard working and loving company, designers, and crew who have manifested this work here for our 14th Street offering.

Thank YOU, Folk on the Hill, for being here with us discovering ourselves within this blessed fabric known as the live performing arts; the space where powerful communal sharing leads us into bold new territories. You play an imperative part- and to echo Sycorax, for that we are truly grateful.

KATE MUETH (Director/Choreographer/Voice of Sycorax) founded the award-winning The Neo-Political Cowgirls (NPC)18 years ago to help fill the dearth of opportunities for and stories from the perspectives of women and the under-represented on our theater landscape. She conceives, writes, choreographs and directs new, site-specific theater and dance theater that is "Mind-bending, gorgeous, provocative and wild" in execution. Kate is an Equity actor, a proud Board Member and Officer Emeritus for The League of Professional Theatre Women, and

co-founder of The East Hampton Arts Council. Kate has worked as actor/director/choreographer with such luminaries as Blythe Danner, Cathy Curtin, Aida Turturro, Tony Walton, Peter Boyle, Laura Gomez, Florencia Lozano and more. She has performed and/or directed at Lincoln Center, Bay Street Theater, Guild Hall, in Berlin, Helsinki and in regional venues. The She Wolves was built with funding support from Suffolk Country Department of Economic Development and Planning, and The National Endowment for the Arts' and Arts Midwest's grant Shakespeare in American Communities. The She-Wolves first look performance came in a summer 2024 run at LongHouse Reserve then visited local East End schools and now makes it's NYC debut presented in it's next exploratory iteration. NPC is the standing Performing Arts company in residence at LongHouse Reserve where in 2023 Kate created three performances to activate the gorgeous sculpture and garden grounds. NPC's 2023

production, THE DREAMER (A Midsummer Night's Dream Through The Eyes of a Young Girl,) was also awarded grant funding from The National Endowment for the Arts and Arts Midwest and enjoyed four lives, among them an Off-Broadway run at HERE Arts, LTV Studios on the East End. and at LongHouse Reserve. Favorite acting roles include Lady M, Varya, and Mrs. Wadhurst in *Tonight at 8:30* with Blythe Danner. History of new, devised works for NPC includes BAUBO, Wody Girtch Mama, Trojan Women Redux, ZIMA!, VOYEUR, EVE, B(e)RD and countless one- offs. HYSTERIA, a "surround fear experience" played to East End audiences as well as attendees at The Old South Church in Boston fall of 2019. The summers of 2016/17 her production of ANDROMEDA, a "Myth for the masses, "Gave voice to the universal refugee," in its performance on the hills of Montauk under the stars. EVE, a 13-room, immersive experience. enjoyed two seasons in the Hamptons then an Off-Broadway run in the fall of 2015 at The Gym at Judson. VOYEUR, a branded NPC site-specific experiential performance made in various unusual spaces, made its European debut in Berlin in July of 2015. Kate has a lengthy biography in theater arts teaching and curriculum building over the past 30 years. Her work in conceiving, developing, directing and teaching theater arts programs continue to annually serve and empower our community's youth, at-risk, marginalized populations, and through creative programs for women. She has furthered her passion for Arts Education by training with the prestigious Arts Leadership program at Lincoln Center and trained with Jacob's Pillow in their celebrated Curriculum In Motion Institute, and now serves on their advisory board. She centers her work around shifting American culture to become more invested in the performing arts as ignition for human connection, problem solving, and thriving. She is mother to August Gladstone, a 2022 Emerson College graduate now residing in Los Angeles working for 3Arts Entertainment as he builds towards becoming a show runner writing for film and television. She is proud to share her life with the talented Josh Gladstone, her favorite collaborator.
